Thursday 5 February 3:45pm Registration 4pm - 5:30pm	Global Explorations Launch Global thinking starts with data, curiosity, and connections. Through this learning journey, students will develop international mindedness, data literacy skills, critical thinking, and teamwork. We begin with a face-to-face introductory workshop, move through four weeks of interactive online learning, and culminate in a high-energy collaborative challenge morning at QACI.
Online Emailed Monday 11 February 4-week course	Global Explorations Online Students will engage in weekly short learning activities (about 60–90 minutes) to build skills and understanding in topics such as maps, global data and nutrition, artificial intelligence, and languages. At the end of each week, they complete a short quiz to check their learning and prepare for the collaborative challenge *Brilliant Futures students are expected to complete at least one face-to-face engagement as well as engage in the online course.

KEY DATES - BRILLIANT FUTURES PROJECT (Term 2)

In this Year 8 project, students will explore the story behind an issue linked to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. From the journey of clean water in a community, to the impact of fast fashion, to how renewable energy is transforming lives, students will investigate and share what they discover. They'll ask critical questions, compare perspectives, and evaluate the significance of their chosen topic. The project will finish with students presenting their findings as a short presentation or digital artefact for peers, parents, and the school community. This project is in THREE phases: Proposal, Research and Communication.
